Globally: *About 5.9 million children under the age of 5 years died in 2015 (the majority in Africa)- that is about **11 children deaths every minute**. Everyday about 830 women die because of pregnant and childbirth reasons with 99% occurring in developing countries (majority in Africa) – that is about **35 maternal deaths every hour**.*
